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Executive Summary

Kanchan Vidhya Mandir Samudayik College has completed its 14 years of service of imparting higher level education to the students of this province. This institution was established in the year 2066 BS. It had dispatched its first batch of graduates in the year 2069 (BS). So far the college has dispatched nine batches of graduates of bachelor level. Recently it has started classes of MBS program under the semester system.

At present (i.e. in the fiscal year 2081/082), 107 students enrolled in BBS Program and 9 students in MBS Program in this college. Out of the total students, 39 are males and 77 are females. The number of Dalit students are 8, and the numbers of Janjati students are 3. There is no physically disabled student studying in this college. The college provides discount facilities on fee to financially weak students. The college provides discounts on fees, scholarship schemes and books to the needy students. This institution aspires to create an educated, ethical and prosperous society by imparting higher education to youth and enabling them towards integral human and career development in industrial and commercial sectors. It strives at maintaining academic excellence, healthy standards in extracurricular practices and at developing entrepreneurship skills among the students.

Besides teaching and learning activities the college focus to extracurricular activities also. It conducts cultural programs and organizes athletic meet on yearly basis. It also promotes to develop research skill, communication skill, and analytical skill among the student. The college also gives due consideration in promoting civic sense and social consciousness in the students. The main aim of this college is to develop the intellectual capacity of students. It also aims to impart quality and value based education to the youth.

Currently the college is running 4-year BBS program at bachelor level and MBS semester system program at Master Level. Both programs BBS and MBS are affiliated to T.U. The college has strength of 14 teachers. This is a community-based college registered under the Act of TU. It is a service motive organization. This institution is operated and governed by a board of management committee formed under the supervision of Tribhuvan University.

The fiscal year 2080-081 the annual income was Rs. 26,770,368.36 out of which Rs. 10,866,935 was generated from students' fees, Rs 10,931,166.66 was received as grants from UGC, Rs 1,492.140 was received as grants from Government in Source and Rs 3,480,126.70 was received from other sources. And the opening bank balance stood at Rs 18,409,568.41. The annual expenditure stood at Rs 25,652,415.09. Out of the total annual expenditure, staff salary was Rs 12,150,434.36. The college has a four-storey building for running BBS and MBS classes. The college also has other infrastructure

facilities such as library, play-ground, cycle stand, motorcycle stand, canteen, water supply, washroom and educational materials like photocopy machine, laptops, projectors smart board etc.

In the current annual year 2081/082 the college has made improvement in infrastructure development. It has constructed a canteen hall, bicycle stand, motorcycle stand, footpath and park.

This annual report of 2081/082 presents a brief description on educational, physical and financial progress in a systematic manner presented under different topics.

1. Background Information

Kanchan Vidhya Mandir Samudayik College is a Community College established to impart higher level education to the students of Sudurpaschim Province of Nepal. It is affiliated to Tribhuvan University. This college has served to be an important institution for providing an access for education to the students of both remote hilly and Terai region of Mahakali Zone. This institution at first started its BBS class in 2066 BS. Since its inception this college has completed eight batches of students in bachelor level.

At present in the fiscal year 2081/082, 718 students study in this college i.e. 649 from BBS and 69 students from MBS level. In the previous year (i.e. fiscal year 2080/081) 904 students were enrolled in BBS program and 121 students were enrolled in MBS program. The college is committed to serve the society in education sector and to produce skilled human resources. The aim of this college is to impart quality and value based education to the youth so that they can contribute to the national economic and social growth.

Within a span of short time this college has been able to maintain goodwill and esteem in the eyes of the people of Sudurpaschim Province of Nepal.

The College has conferred with QAA certificate in 2076/09/07 from UGC. The college is committed to make improvement in its management sector and making students more responsible towards their duties and responsibilities.




Figure 1 Enrolment Trend Analysis for BBS Program




Figure 2 Enrolment Trend Analysis for MBS Program

The diagram given below presents the income generated from students' fee and the percentage of students' fee to total income over the past three years.




Figure 3 Analysis of income from student fee (Self generated income)




Figure 4 Percentage of student fee to total income

The diagram given below presents the amount of grant received from UGC in the year 2078/079, 2079/080 and 2080/081




Figure 4 Analysis of grant / income from UGC and government source From the table and diagram, it is clear that Kanchan Vidhya Mandir Samudayik College has been receiving regular grants from UGC. The average grant from UGC has figured up to 27.51 percent of total income.

The salary expenditure has increased from 10025540.31 to 12150434.36. The other regular expenditure increased from 2890438.12 to 4934100.04. The total expenditure has also increased from 22721434.30 to 25652415.09. The average total expenditure during the last three years amounted to 22507927.91 rupees.

In the year 2080/081 Number of the teaching staff was 14. The diagram below shows the amount of annual expenditure on staff salary.





Figure 5 Analysis of Staff Salary

From the table and diagram, it is clear that the percentage of staff salary with respect to total expenditure in the financial year, 2078-079, 2079-080 and 2080-081 amounted to 77.62%, 68.72% and 71.11% respectively. The average salary expenses stood at 72.48%.




Figure 6 Analysis of Staff Salary

The above diagram shows that the recurrent expenditures of past three years are rupees 28.90 lakh, 51.88 and 49.34 lakh. The average expenditure trend is rupees 43.37 lakh.





Figure 7 Analysis of Capital Expenditure



The diagram given below presents the expenditure on building construction





The diagram given below presents the expenditure on computer purchase




